

### At a Glance

Starting this year, you have a lot more choice about what you learn. But, in order to graduate with a Dogwood Diploma, every student in the Graduation Program has to pass certain basic courses, such as English, math and science.

For Grade 10 students entering the Graduation Program in 2017/18, the table below provides an overview of what you need to graduate:

- 52 credits from required courses
- 28 credits from electives

Preparing now will help ensure you get the credits you need to achieve your goals. Graduation requirements are introduced in Planning 10. For more help, talk to your teacher or school counsellor.

Special rules apply to Programme Francophone and French Immersion students pursuing both English and French Dogwood Diplomas ("Dual Dogwoods"). Speak to your counsellor for information.





# Self Reporting of Grades/Interim/ Official Transcripts

### What is self-reporting?

"Self-reporting is the process of submitting your up-to-date grades electronically to UBC's Undergraduate Admissions office so we can give you a timely admissions decision. If you are currently a Grade 12 student from BC or Yukon, you will be required to report your grades using our online self-reporting tool. You can access the self-reporting tool on the <a href="Student Service Centre">Student Service Centre</a> (SSC) from March 2 to April 7. Self-reporting is mandatory and failure to self-report will result in an automatic cancellation of your application."

### **Transcripts**:

A new website called Student Transcript Service has been created for students to access and have their transcripts sent to Post Secondary schools of their choice. The following slides will provide a step by step guide in setting up an account and then choosing and giving the Ministry permission to send your transcript to the schools of your choice. The website address is:

### Final transcript:

Final official transcript will be sent in August provided you have given permission to the Ministry of Education.

# Transcripts (STS)

The Ministry of Education has just launched the StudentTranscripts Service (STS), a new online application for students to view their marks, scholarships and transcripts, and send transcripts to post-secondary institutions and third parties.

Ministry of Education is opening the ability to send transcripts to post-secondary institutions (PSIs) to all current grades 10, 11, 12, and adult students. These current students may access up to 25 complimentary – please note these 25 complimentary selections are not ongoing after graduation. Past graduates may access additional copies of their transcripts via this service for a fee of \$10 per copy.

To access the service, students will go to the Ministry of Education's transcripts and certificates website at <a href="www.StudentTranscripts.gov.bc.ca">www.StudentTranscripts.gov.bc.ca</a>. Please note that all students must register for a BC Government account (a BCeID). After registering for a BCeID, students follow the system prompts and register for STS. Finally, they log in to the StudentTranscripts Service using the BCeID. From a student's STS Dashboard, they are able to make post-secondary institution selections, view their transcript and assessment results, and send transcripts immediately to post-secondary institutions and other third parties.

Students who have not been reported to TRAX previously (mainly new Grade 10 students) will not be able to register for STS until their school uploads their TRAX submission this fall. The 'transcript send' service is intended for grade 12 students; please discourage grade 10-11 students from making PSI selections unless they are applying for post-secondary studies in 2018.

StudentTranscripts replaces the PSI Selections function previously available on the Student Secure Web. Using StudentTranscripts, current students will be able to select if they want to send a transcript now, in the spring (interim), and/or when final marks are complete.

#### **Taking a Correspondence Course**

#### **Distributed Learning courses:**

Interim and final marks (some schools require course to be completed by Feb)
Example: **UBC** - Completion dates for Distributed Learning courses:
If you wish to use your Distributed Learning course in the calculation of your *competitive admission average*, the course must be 100% complete by **February 1** and your Distributed Learning provider/school must submit the final grade to the Ministry of Education so that it appears on your Ministry of Education Student Secure Web in time for you to self-report these grades in March/April.

Distributed learning courses completed by **June 30** can be used to meet prerequisites but will not be used in the calculation of your competitive admission average.

**Final Transcript will state DTSS** as graduating school unless correspondence course is finished after student has graduated.

# **BC Achievement Scholarships**

- BC Achievement Scholarships recognize the top 8000 graduates in the province.
- The Ministry will determine recipients based on achievement in Grades 10, 11, and 12 courses that satisfy <u>2004 Graduation Program</u> requirements, including elective courses. Grad Transitions will not be included.
- A cumulative average percentage will be calculated and form the basis for determining winners, who receive a \$1250 scholarship voucher to use towards their post-secondary tuition.
- Students do not apply for this scholarship.
- Eligibility
- Recipients must:
- Meet basic eligibility requirements:
- Fulfil graduation requirements of the <u>2004 Graduation Program</u> by August 31 of the student's graduating year
- Have at least a "B" (73% or above) in their Language Arts 12 course
- Write and pass a Language Arts 12 provincial examination
- Have no more than one Transfer Standing (TS) or Standing Granted (SG) indicator among course marks used for the calculation of winners, excluding Language Arts 12, which must have a percentage score.

# **District/Authority Scholarships**

- The District/Authority Scholarships reward graduating students for excellence in their chosen field of interest or
- strength. These scholarships are intended to assist with tuition for post-secondary education.
- The Ministry will allocate 5500 scholarships pro-rated to school districts and independent school authorities based
- on each district's September 30th Grade 12 enrolment. The scholarship will now be a \$1250 voucher that can be
- used toward post-secondary education tuition.
- QUALIFYING FOR A DISTRICT/AUTHORITY SCHOLARSHIP
- To win a scholarship, a student must apply and:
  - a) Meet the basic eligibility requirements
  - b) Meet criteria determined by the local scholarship committee, which requires a student to demonstrate outstanding achievement in any of the following areas:
- NEW: Indigenous Languages and Culture, demonstrated at school or in the community
- Fine Arts (e.g., Visual Arts, Dance, Drama, Music)
- Applied Skills (e.g., Business Ed, Technology Ed, Home Economics)
- Physical Activity (e.g., Athletics, Dance, Gymnastics, not limited to Physical Education)
- International Languages with Integrated Resource Packages (IRPs) or External Assessments, including AP and IB courses
- **Community Service** (Volunteer Activity), which includes demonstration of local and global issues and cultural awareness
- Technical and Trades Training (e.g., Carpentry, Automotive, Mechanics, Cook Training)
  - c) Fulfill the BC Graduation requirements of either the 2004 Graduation Program or the Adult Graduation Program by August 31st of the student's graduating year
  - d) Have not previously received a District/Authority Award or a District/Authority Scholarship
  - e) Committee criteria must ensure that winners have been cumulatively evaluated in the area of achievement chosen for presentation to the committee, and satisfy other criteria which may include factors such as attendance, punctuality, work habits and cooperation.

## **BC Excellence Scholarships**

- There are 55 BC Excellence Scholarships available to recognize well-rounded B.C. graduates. Winners will have demonstrated service and leadership, both at school and in their communities, and shown aptitude and commitment to their chosen career paths. They will receive a \$5000 scholarship voucher to use for post-secondary tuition.
- Nomination and Application
- Students must be nominated by their secondary school in order to apply for this scholarship. Only one student from each school may be nominated. Please inquire at your school if you would like to be considered for nomination. Students must confirm their nomination by having their school principal sign and date the verification section of the application form.
- The <u>application package (PDF)</u>, includes a written statement worth 60% overall, and the resume worth 40% overall. It must be completed online in the mandatory format, printed, signed, and submitted by mail. <u>Scoring guides (PDF)</u> are available for reference. Incomplete applications will not be accepted.
- Eligibility
- Nominees must:
- Meet basic eligibility requirements
- Be in their graduation year with graduation to occur by August 31 of the school year in which they are nominated
- Be eligible for a B.C. Certificate of Graduation (Dogwood Diploma) and fulfill graduation requirements of the 2004 Graduation Program by August 31, 2017
- Have at least a:
  - "B" (73% or above) in their Language Arts 11 final mark
  - "B" average in final course marks that fulfill graduation requirements of Science 11 or 12, Math 11 and Social Studies 11 or 12, with no more than one "C+" (67% or above) final course mark, (marks lower than "C+" are not accepted)
- Maintain a "B" average or better in Grades 11 and 12 final course marks required for graduation
- Write and pass a Language Arts 12 provincial examination
- You cannot win both a BC Excellence Scholarship and a <u>Pathway to Teacher Education Scholarship</u>.
- Nominees' application package (PDF) must include:
- Resume in the mandatory format
- Two reference letters, one from your community and one from your school
- A written statement, maximum 500 words, which must describe:
  - What led you to your most relevant community service, volunteer activity, and/or leadership role, and
  - What you learned from this experience, and
  - How this experience will benefit you in your chosen career path.

# Pathway to Teacher Education Scholarship

- The Pathway to Teacher Education Scholarship is awarded to 20 outstanding high school graduates who have demonstrated a commitment and aptitude for a career path in K-12 teaching. Winners receive a \$5000 scholarship voucher to redeem when they are registered and attending an approved K-12 teacher education program at one of BC's nine Faculties of Education.
- Application
- Complete the <u>application package (PDF)</u>, including the written statement worth 60% overall, and the resume worth 40% overall. It must be completed online using the mandatory format, printed, signed, and submitted by mail. <u>Scoring guides (PDF)</u> are available for reference. Incomplete applications will not be accepted.
- Completed applications must be submitted to the Ministry no later than February 15, 2017.

#### Eligibility

- Applicants must:
- Meet basic eligibility requirements
- Be in your graduation year with graduation to occur by August 31 of the school year in which you apply
- Be eligible for a B.C. Certificate of Graduation (Dogwood Diploma) and fulfill graduation requirements of the 2004 Graduation Program by August 31, 2017
- Have at least a:
  - "B" (73% or above) in your Language Arts 11 final mark
  - "B" average in final course marks that fulfill graduation requirements of Science 11 or 12, Math 11 and Social Studies
     11 or 12, with no more than one "C+" (67% or above) final course mark, (marks lower than "C+" are not accepted)
- Maintain a "B" average or better in Grades 11 and 12 final course marks required for graduation
- Write and pass a Language Arts 12 provincial examination
- You cannot win both a Pathway to Teacher Education Scholarship and a <u>BC Excellence Scholarship</u>.
- Your application package must include:
- Resume in the mandatory format
- Two reference letters, one from your community and one from your school
- A written statement, maximum 500 words, which describes why you want to be a teacher.


## **Youth Work in Trades Awards**

- The Youth Work in Trades provides skill development through practical, hands-on work experience.
- Students enrolled in these courses go to work and attend high school at the same time. That means they have found an employer who is willing to take them on (and pay them) as an apprentice at least until their high school graduation. School counsellors may be able to offer help with this step.
- Students that are 15 or older can enroll in this program they must also formally register with the Industry Training Authority as Youth Apprentices. Successful completion of the program earns students 16 credits towards graduation. Some may also qualify for the YWT award– a \$1000 award given to students for sustained and exceptional work as an apprentice.
- If you are a high school student already working as an apprentice, speak to your high school counsellor today about signing up for this program.
- \$1000 Scholarship Criteria
- To be eligible an Industry Training Authority (ITA)-registered youth apprentice must have:
- Been registered in a school district Youth Work in Trades Program prior to graduation
- Graduated with a Grade 12 Dogwood Diploma or Adult Dogwood
- Successfully completed WRK1A, WRK1B, WRK2A and WRK2B.
- Maintained a C+ average or better on Grade 12 numbered courses
- Reported a total of at least 900 hours to the ITA within six months of graduation

# **Tuition Deposits**

Tuition deposit required to register for courses.

**Example: UofA**: Students who are offered admission must pay a non-refundable \$500 Tuition Deposit in order to become eligible to register in courses. Students can pay this deposit on Bear Tracks, and it will be credited towards their final tuition amount. If you do not accept your offer and pay the tuition deposit by the **deadline** stated in Bear Tracks, your admission offer will be revoked.

**UVIC** - \$200 acceptance deposit

#### **Acceptance or Conditional Acceptance:**

- Each PSI has different times they will offer **Conditional Acceptance.** Most Alberta PSI's send conditional offers of admission earlier than BC PSI's. Final Transcripts are reviewed by PSI in August, which if the student does not meet the expected requirements, the conditional offer of admission will be revoked.
- Decisions if have you applied to several schools, you will need to make some decisions.

#### **Degree Requirements/ Planning Documents**

PSI's do provide guidance in the form of workshops and/or documents can be found in PSI Calendars.

#### **Full Load or Not**

Important to consider whether to take a full load of courses consisting of 5 courses per semester. Some **Child Education Funds** require a fulltime load which could be 3, 4 or 5 courses per semester. Please read your specific contract.

#### **GPA**

Every course you attempt at a PSI is on your transcript whether you are successful or not, which impacts your overall GPA.

# Confirmation of Acceptance & Other Information

- Check in August to Confirm Acceptance
- Change your mind: Deferring Your Admission and/ or Contact school
- ``If you are offered admission to full-time study in the first year of a degree program, you may request a deferral for one year (or two years for mandatory military service).
- To be eligible for a deferral, you must:
- Accept the offer of admission and pay your acceptance deposit
- Submit an Deferred Admission Request Form by July 15.
   If your deferral request is granted, we will provide you with a new UBC student number and a new admission-confirmation letter early in the new year."
- Otherwise, do correspond with the PSI if you have changed your mind and are not going to attend.

## **Orientation Sessions**

- Most PSI's offer Orientation Sessions a couple of days prior to the start of classes for students and parents to better understand Post Secondary life.
- They also have Student Services where counselors are available to assist on many different levels.
