- Funding Requests

1. Climate Club – Jules Turtle

\$500 for plants for the interior of the school – to green DTSS. Wildsight has donated plants already. Custodians have agreed to care for the plants over the summer. The Climate Club has worked on educating students about what we can do about climate change, we have volunteered for community clean-ups, planning on assisting JA Laird students in starting a Climate Club

2. Food Security – Shannon Warren

\$200/month for April, May and June = \$600 – to assist with the cost of providing student meals

3. Grad – Roxanne Rad

\$500 for 2 Large pots and flowers for the stage at Grad. The pots will be used again and again in future years. Flowers are often given by the elementary schools.

4. Art Club – Robyn Oliver

\$500 - Pottery has been very popular and we have used up the clay and glazes bought at the beginning of the year. These funds would go towards additional clay and glazes so that students can continue to explore ceramic arts.

5. Extracurricular Activities – Glen Sage

\$2000 – funds to be held and used to ensure that all students are able to participate in extracurricular trips – Sports, Music, Arts, Science

6. Dry Grad

Up to \$1000 – for entertainment costs for Dry Grad. In past PAC has donated \$500 to this.
