INDIGENOUS-FOCUSED GRADUATION REQUIREMENT



The BC Ministry of Education is implementing an Indigenous-focused graduation requirement for all secondary students, <u>beginning in the 2023-2024 school year.</u>

This transformative change to the Graduation Program represents the Province of British Columbia's commitments to truth, reconciliation and anti-racisim. All BC students will be provided with the necessary time and opportunity to develop deeper understandings of the experiences, cultures and histories of Indigenous peoples in Canada.

The proposed change to the B.C. Graduation Program will require that 4 credits of the current 80 credit requirements for the BC Certificate of Graduation (Dogwood Diploma) include an Indigenous-focused course(s). Secondary students will be able to meet the new requirement through a variety of existing and new course options.

Implementation of the new requirement involved a phased-in approach and the Ministry of Education engaged with Indigenous communities, the education sector and the public on the implementation plan, which will take effect in the 2023-2024

school year.
